The Prince Sultan Water Specialist Event Participation Grant enables distinguished scholars, as well as innovative water scientists from the developing world, and young researchers from all over the world, to attend conferences, seminars, workshops, and specialised courses.

The grant is offered in partnership with the organisation holding the event. The organisation chooses the recipient of its own accord, based on the suitability of the recipient to make a positive contribution to, or benefit from, the event; the need of the recipient; and the innovative nature of the recipient's water-related work.

Organisations wishing to cooperate in the grant programme should contact the Prince Sultan Bin Abdulaziz International Prize for Water at info@psipw.org. Organisations holding water-related scientific conferences, seminars, workshops, and short courses are eligible.

Grant recipients are chosen by the cooperating organisations. Individuals seeking grants should not apply to PSIPW directly.

PSIPW will receive the identity, brief description, and high-resolution photo of the recipient from the participating organisation. The description will include what is innovative and important about the recipient's work. PSIPW reserves the right to decline the proposed recipient if it is determined that giving the grant to that recipient poses a conflict of interest for PSIPW. If that happens, the partner organisation must choose another recipient.

The grant programme is coordinated as part of the PSIPW outreach campaign and comes in the context of event sponsorship, so PSIPW will receive normal sponsorship package benefits, like brochure distribution, a showing of the PSIPW film, and a page in the conference proceedings. PSIPW deals financially only with the cooperating organisation. Payments are made to the recipients by way of the cooperating organisation.
